1. Call to Order, Introductions, & Public Comments – All members	Chair Parshley called the Climate Action Steering Committee (CASC) meeting to order at 3:01 pm.
	Steering Committee members, support staff from Thurston Regional Planning Council (TRPC), and staff from Thurston County and the cities of Lacey, Olympia, and Tumwater provided self-introductions.
	Chair Parshley requested an amendment to the agenda to remove agenda item 2b: Regional Guidance and ILA.
	Committee Member Swarthout, moved, seconded by Committee Member Cox to amend and approve the agenda.  • Motion to adopt the Climate Action Steering Committee amended agenda is approved.
	Chair Parshley requested approval of the February 27, 2023, meeting summary.
	Committee Member Swarthout requested a change to the summary to replace tree "study" in jurisdictional updates with tree "codes."
	Committee Member Cox, moved, seconded by Committee Member Swarthout to approve the amended February 27, 2023, meeting summary.
	<ul> <li>Motion to adopt the amended Climate Action Steering Committee's February 27, 2023 meeting summary is approved.</li> </ul>
	Chair Parshley called for comments from members of the public. There was 1 public comment from Melinda Hughes.
2a. Advisory Workgroup Update – Casey Mauck, TRPC	Mauck gave an overview of the March 7 <sup>th</sup> Climate Advisory Workgroup (CAW) meeting. The workgroup discussed the proposed regional guidance for TCMP implementation going forward. In general, members were happy with the expanded role of the CAW, to review individual jurisdiction actions in addition to regional actions, and the level of input they are proposed to have in the regional





	initiatives process. Members understood why the proposal includes
	removing member organizations to focus the group on community
	input, though they hope some of the member organization
	representatives may apply as community members. Members
	expressed a desire for a single point-of-contact for regional climate
	action and more transparency of staff team meetings.
2b. Regional Guidance and	This agenda item has been moved to a future meeting. Members
ILA – Allison Osterberg, TRPC	wished to tentatively set a May 22 <sup>nd</sup> Steering Committee meeting to
,	discuss this item, pending staff approval of the guidance and ILA.
2c. Energy Efficiency – Allison	Osterberg provided an overview of residential energy efficiency as a
Osterberg, TRPC	climate mitigation strategy. Reducing energy use in existing
osterberg, Thi e	residential buildings is strategy B1 of the TCMP, and helps to achieve
	the 2030 and 2050 targets for reducing electricity and natural gas use.
	Approximately 70% of dwelling units are in the city limits or urban
	growth areas of Lacey, Olympia, and Tumwater, and 13% of county
	residents are considered to have a high energy burden while 7% are
	considered to have a severe energy burden. There are many existing
	state, federal, and utility incentives that can be used for energy
	efficiency projects, and funding sources for larger grants. TCMP
	partners could support energy efficiency by tracking rulemaking and
	funding opportunities, providing technical assistance and outreach to
	connect residents with resources, providing financial incentives, or
	setting stricter regulations.
	Members suggested coordinating between housing agencies who
	may already be providing some of these resources, or providing
	education to agencies on potential opportunities.
3a. Jurisdictional Information	Thurston County (Tye Menser) – The county has been working with
Sharing – All Members	DNR to try to preserve legacy forests in Capitol State Forest. The
	County Commissioners signed a joint letter with Snohomish,
	Jefferson, and Whatcom Counties to support a legislative bill that
	would provide additional funding to preserve the oldest forestlands.
	Committee Member Menser interviewed for a seat on the State
	Building Code Council and should hear back soon. Staff has been
	working on applying for electric vehicle grant opportunities and
	briefed the commission on EVs.
	Shered the commission on Lvs.
	Lacey (Carolyn Cox) – Lacey has been working with PSE on a match
	program for the rebates that PSE offers for energy efficiency and
	,
	weatherization. Lacey will use some of their climate funding to match
	the PSE rebates. There are 3 finalists for the Climate Coordinator
	position and the new member should be joining this team shortly.
	The comprehensive plan update is underway and staff are working to
	refine the climate policies in the plan.





Tumwater (Eileen Swarthout) – Tumwater is applying for grants to install electric vehicle chargers at Pioneer Park, conduct a feasibility study for solar and battery backup at the library and city hall, and inventory trees on city property. The city is working to identify and protect heritage trees, including a focus on Garry oaks.

Olympia (Lisa Parshley) – Olympia is working to get a consultant for an electrification assessment of their fleet including infrastructure analysis. The City is working on launching the heat pump group purchase campaign and reviewing proposals from installers. The climate risk and vulnerability assessment is ongoing and the City is now recruiting community members for the project team.
